 Fill with Clay from 2510 to 2295 feet, Tool Plug 2295 to 2292 feet.  
 Cement 2292 to 2287 feet.

Set a permanent bridge at 855 feet, 30 feet under coal, Clay 855 to 850 feet. Cement 850 to 800 feet. Clay from 800 to 700 feet.

A marker will be erected as called for in the law.

Fill with clay from the bottom 2295 to 2292 - 20' above the bit-train  
 Drive wood plug from 2195 to 2190  
 Cement from 2185 to 2180


Continue to fill with clay from 2190 to 2180 - 2' below the 6-5/8" casing  
 Drive wood plug from 2180 to 2175  
 PULL 6-5/8" casing

SET A PERMANENT BRIDGE AT 1985 - 20' below the Dixon Sand.  
 Fill with clay from 1985 to 1820 - 20' above the Dixon Sand.  
 Cement from 1820 to 1810

SET A PERMANENT BRIDGE AT 1765 - 20' below the salt sand.  
 Fill with clay from 1965 to 1765  
 Cement from 1765 to 1755

Fill with clay from 1715 to 835 - 30' below the coal seam  
 Cement from 835 to 800  
 Fill with clay from 800 to the surface and  
 Erect a marker such as is described in Rule 19, 1931 Regulations  
 To the Department of Mines,  
 Coal Owner or Operator, All in done in a work-order-like manner.  
 Less or Property Owner.

Gentlemen:  
 This "work order" is submitted for your approval and concurrence and when notified of your disapproval or non-concurrence, the undersigned will proceed with the plastering and filling of said well in the above described manner on the date stated in the notice of intention to plug and abandon the said well on opposite side of this sheet.



You are further notified that whether you are represented or not represented the undersigned will proceed on that date, or shortly thereafter, to plug and fill said well in the manner required by Section 10, Article 4, Chapter 22 of the Code and given in detail on the reverse side of this notice, in "Work Order."

NOTE: Upon the abandonment of all wells drilled prior to June 1, 1923, a plat prepared by a competent engineer of the district and county in which the tract of land is located, the name and acreage of same, the location of the corners of adjacent tracts, and the location of the point to be abandoned well, determined by survey, shall be filed in the office of the county clerk and the distance of each well from two permanent points or landmarks on said tract, shall be indicated.
