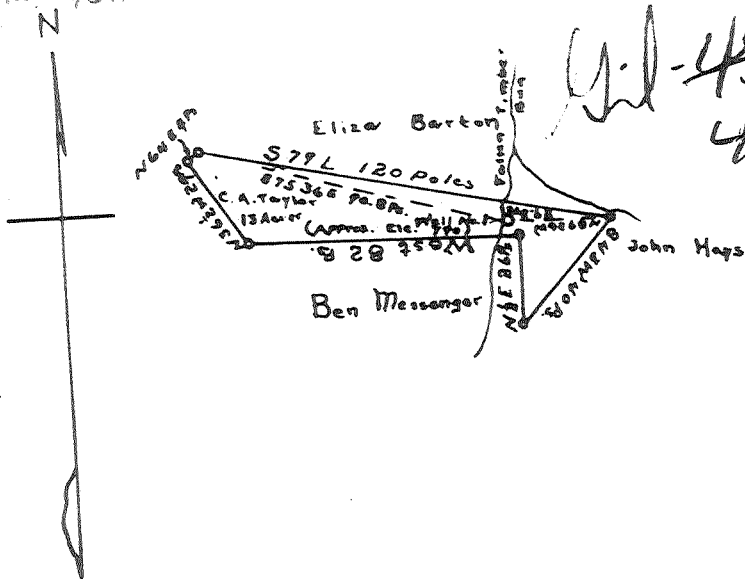

Leroy Cassady and George Cassady
being first duly sworn according to law depose and say that they are experienced in the work of plugging and filling oil and gas wells and were employed by E. L. Rakle, well operator, and participated in the work of plugging and filling the above well, that said work was commenced on the 1st day of July, 1933, and that the well was plugged and filled in the following manner:

Manner in which well was plugged:

With red clay from bottom up to 20' above big injun sand. Lead plug set about 20' feet above big injun sand, cement set permanent bridge 30' below salt sand; filled with red clay to 20' above salt sand; set wood plug about 30' above salt sand filled with red clay to within 300 feet of top of well; set wood plug there; filled with red clay to 392 feet from top of well filled with red clay to top. Lead plug was further sealed with cement plug about 3' then at intervals above 5 other 3' cement plugs in each case was plugged.

No coal that we knew of.

Description of monument:

cement monument marked Taylor no. 1 & E Rakle
