

SPECIAL REPORT

Colin Anderson Center Grounds

DATE: October 28, 1981

Upon arrival at the scene at approximately 1:00 PM on October 27, 1981, a visual examination of the well site revealed that the location is near the crest of a hill with the "frac" pit located on the downhill side of the location. An Adams Well Service drilling rig was badly burned and had toppled over against the hillside from the well. The "doghouse" was completely destroyed and nearly all areas on the lower portion of the rig were twisted and badly charred. The pumping valves from a Halliburton Well Service truck were still attached to the rig. The Halliburton pumping truck sat near the well with the deisel engine compartment completely burned out. Apparently this truck had been pulled back away from the well by workers after the well had been extinguished to allow easier access to the wellhead. The skids had also apparently been moved back for the same reason. The "frac" pit was filled with water and drilling fluids, but did not seem to contain a significant amount of oil. The well by this time was under control and a swedge had been installed on the wellhead. It was still bubbling at a moderate rate however. Several articles of partially burned clothing and damaged hard hats lay about the location, as did blood-stained wrappings, apparently used in first aid efforts.

A conversation with Bud Adams of Berg Petroleum and Adams Well Service revealed that the accident occurred at around 4:30 AM on the 27th of October, 1981. His account was that the well had been completely drilled to a total depth of 4632 feet. His employees had been placing the $4\frac{1}{2}$ inch casing in the well and at the time of the explosion the Halliburton engineer was circulating cement to set the $4\frac{1}{2}$. Adams explained that the well had accumulated water and oil while inserting the casing and apparently when the cement was circulated water, oil and gas were brought to the surface and the gas ignited.

Although Mr. Adams was not present at the time of the explosion he gave an account that the Halliburton engineer, when circulating the cement, was told by others at the site to cut back the pressure, but instead ignored their instructions and opened up the pressure and that the explosion occurred at that time. Mr. Adams did not tell his source of such information.

Mr. Adams said that two of his employees were injured: (1) Jim Morris who worked for Adams Well Service and (2) Bill Fisher who worked for Berg Petroleum. Subsequent newspaper reports identify these individuals as John Morris, 26 of Quaker City, Ohio and Eugene Fisher, 24 of Weston, W. Va.

Conversations with a Halliburton Well Service employee revealed that three (3) employees of that company were injured: (1) Keith Marshall, (2) Bill Rayburn, and (3) an unknown man from Weston, W. Va. Subsequent newspaper accounts identify these individuals as Charles Marshall, 25 of Marietta, Ohio, William Rayburn, 32 of Marietta, Ohio and Thomas Miltonberger, 24 of Weston, W. Va. Apparently all but Mr. Miltonberger were seriously injured and were admitted to the West Penn Burn Center in Pittsburgh, Pa.

The investigating police officer at the incident was Trooper Lake of the St. Marys detachment of the W. Va. State Police. Apparently the Pleasants County Sheriffs Department also investigated the scene. Representatives of OSHA were notified by Jim Wallington upon our return to Charleston at approximately 4:20 PM on October 27, 1981.
