4377	4386	9	Chert, gray, calcareous; and very cherty limestone; contains small dolomite crystals and a little fine detrital quartz (silt)
4386	4403	13	Limestone, gray, very cherty, dolomitic; light-gray except for 3 foot darker at top; contains a little secondary crystalline quartz, a little sphalerite (4399-4401), a little silt and glauconite (4397-4403)
4403	4410	7	Chert and very cherty limestone, gray, dolomitic, with a little silt
4410	4412	2	Sandstone, dark-gray, very fine, cherty, calcareous, pyritic; contains also sphalerite, dolomite and a very little glauconite
4412	4413	6	Chert, gray to light-brown, highly calcareous; abundant dolomitic rhombs and cubic pyrite crystals
4413	4423	5	Limestone, gray, very cherty; contains some dolomite and a little glauconite

4423	4425	2	Sandstone, light-gray, moderately calcareous, medium-grained, fairly well rounded
4425	4443	23	Sandstone, white, slightly calcareous, very hard; seems to have mostly fine to very fine texture but a considerable proportion of the grains are broken by the drill, so some may be coarser
